

About Lower Gwynedd Township

This Lower Gwynedd Township Trail and Park Map is one of the continuing efforts by the Board of Supervisors to preserve the beauty and history of the township while encouraging a walkable community. First settled in 1698, Gwynedd Township was largely farmland for over a hundred years. With the building of the North Penn Railroad in the 1800s, residents began to choose the scenic countryside of Gwynedd Township to build country estates and summer homes outside of Philadelphia.

The population expanded, prompting leaders to split the township into Upper and Lower Gwynedd in 1891. Lower Gwynedd Township remains a beautiful place to live and a sought-after address in Montgomery County. The township is a little over nine square miles with four villages: Gwynedd, Gwynedd Valley, Spring House, and Penllyn. Traveling through the township you'll get a sense of the community, passing many historic buildings now serving as restaurants, stores, churches, and private homes.
