## Ambulance to be Stationed in Lower Gwynedd Township

O n or about September 1, people passing by the Lower Gwynedd Municipal Building will see an unfamiliar vehicle parked at the Township Building. Chairman Ed Brandt announced recently that the Community Ambulance Association of Ambler (CAAA) has placed an ambulance and crew at the Wissahickon Fire Station in the Municipal Building during the day when calls are heaviest. The new deployment has already yielded successful results. The CAAA has reported that an ambulance dispatched from the Township Building reached an accident scene in sixty seconds. Scott Welker, Executive Director of the CAAA, stated that having an ambulance and crew in Lower Gwynedd will reduce response time and potentially save lives. Lower Gwynedd Township Manager, Larry Comunale, stated that the Township appreciates the ambulance service offered by CAAA and that this would not have been possible without the cooperation of Fire Chief John Leadbeater and the Wissahickon Fire Department.







## **Snow Removal**



#### CORRECT PROCEDURE TO CLEAR SNOW:

Pile snow to the right of the driveway.

#### INCORRECT PROCEDURE TO CLEAR SNOW:

Piled snow to the left of the driveway will cause that snow to be plowed back into the driveway area.



As temperatures fall, so does the snow and ice. While enjoying the winter wonderland, remember these tips to help the township crews clear the roads more quickly and efficiently:

- Move your vehicles out of the street and into private driveways (this also reduces the amount of snow you have to shovel).
- During any snow emergency, all vehicles must be removed from the roadways.
- Wait to shovel your driveway until the plows have completed their final pass along the curb line or edge of pavement. A pass or two through the neighborhood does not mean the Township is finished with the snow removal process and your effort to clear driveway entrance might be wasted.
- Shovel to the right hand side of your driveway to reduce the

amount of snow pushed back onto your driveways by plows (see illustration).

- Clear your sidewalk by shoveling and salting within 24 hours of the last evidence of precipitation.
- Do not throw snow from any sidewalk or driveway into the roadway, it is illegal and you will be cited.
- Keep all receptacles (trash and recycling) on the sidewalk, not in the street.
- If you have an inlet in front of your property, please assist the Township in keeping it clear of snow and ice. This will prevent ice from accumulating and reduce drainage issues when the snow begins to melt.

Please be patient during the snow removal process while the Township's plow operators work to clear the roadways.



## 🥊 Mailboxes

Property owners should check the front of their mailbox to ensure that it is a minimum of 6 inches behind the face of the curb, which is within federal postal regulations. Prior to the start of winter, the homeowner should reset any mailboxes

## 🛓 Holiday Tree Drop-Off

After the Holidays have passed instead of throwing away your Tree, you can drop it off at Ingersol Park parking lot,

protruding past the minimum measurement of 6 inches behind the face of the curb. This will ensure that the mailbox will not be damaged during snow plowing operations. Any damage that may occur is the responsibility of the homeowner.

## Protect Your Home From Burglaries With These Tips

Some residents of Lower Gwynedd, as well as surrounding Stownships, have recently been the victim of daytime burglaries. A person or more than one person may go to a door and knock to see if anyone is home. If it appears the home is empty, they force entry through a door or window in a secluded area.

Here are some tips from the Police Department to secure your family, property and possessions:

- The first step is to harden the target or make your home more difficult to enter. Reinforce entryways by using solid core or metal doors and heavy-duty locks. Use a wide-angle 160° peephole mounted no higher than 58 inches. Insert a wooden dowel or stick into the track of sliding glass doors to prevent or limit movement of the doors.
- 2. Secure all accessible windows with secondary blocking devices.

## Safety on the Trails

Ur area is very lucky to have numerous trails maintained by local municipalities, businesses and institutions. Our trails can be used for recreational purposes on weekends or for a quick exercise break during one's lunch hour. So as you put on your hiking boots or running shoes, think about these safety tips:

- Before you leave your house or office, make sure someone knows where you are going and when they can expect you back.
- Check the weather forecast. There are so many options for weather updates, there is no excuse for not knowing if thunderstorms are in the area. If you want weather watches and warnings sent to your phone register for Montgomery County ReadyNotifyPA.
- Take your phone with you and be sure to have your ICE (in case of emergency) contact programmed into your phone. Make sure you have some type of identification on you.
- If you have to drive to the trail, do not leave anything of value in your car. Thieves are not looking to steal cars, they are looking for cash, credit cards or electronic devises that they can quickly sell for cash. Don't try to outsmart the thieves by putting your valuables in your glove compartment or the trunk. Car windows

- 3. Remove any outside obstructions from doors and windows so that they can be easily seen by others.
- 4. Get to know your neighbors. Agree to keep an eye each other's homes when they are empty.
- 5. If you are going to be away, put interior lights on timers.
- 6. Exterior lights should allow for 100 ft. of visibility and enable you to identify colors.
- 7. If you want to take the extra step, invest in an alarm system. Dogs can also be a deterrent.

The Police also ask that you be familiar with your surroundings. If you see something that is out of place or someone that is not familiar to you or hanging around your neighborhood, please dial 911 and provide as much information to the dispatcher as you can. If you can supply descriptions of actors, clothing and/or vehicles, this is very helpful.

can easily be broken and the trunk popped open.When walking on the trail be aware of natural hazards such as poison ivy, stinging insects, low overhanging limbs or thorny plants and vines.

- Remember that people walking on a trail move at a variety of speeds. Parents and children and people walking their pets often move at a slower speed and make sudden stops. They can veer suddenly into the path of another walker or a cyclist. As a trail user you need to always be aware of your surroundings. If you are the slow walker with a potential "hazard", you need to keep an eye on them and keep them under control.
- If you are the faster moving walker or biker, be sure to pass on the left and warn the person you are passing. This can be by ringing one of those small bicycle bells or saying "passing on the left" loudly enough for the person to hear.
- The Lower Gwynedd Trails are all marked with a letter representing the trail name and a number identifying your section. In the event of an emergency all of the emergency response departments all have access to the trail identification system through Montgomery County Dispatch.

Choose water-based points such as latex, Wash brushes in your sink with water. If using point thinner, reuse and recycle it. Solidified paint can be disposed of in regular household waste. Don't pour any point or takic naterial down the storm drain.

Recycle your used motor oil. Autozone, Valvaline Instant Oil Change, and other service stations in your community accept used oil. Some will also accept your used ontifreeze. Never dump oil or antifreeze down the starm drain which flows into the creeks or rivers.

> Reduce auto expission through regular auto maintenance, ride sharing, and use of public ansportation. Fix oil, radiator and transmission leaks in your car. Don't let your car leave ugly oil slicks behind.

Pick up and properly dispose of leaves and grass clippings. Start a compost pile with yard waste. Never use streams or gutters to dispose of yard waste.





Maintain your septic system. Have it purpped out every 3 years to remove sludge and scum. Do not use tank additives, and practice water conservation to prevent overworking your system. Repair or replace matfunctioning supple systems.

## **Severe Weather Preparedness Measures**

The Montgomery County Office of Emergency Management has issued the following severe weather preparedness measures:



- 1. Clean your gutters and downspouts. Heavy rain is the biggest threat from hurricanes. Making sure the water has a clear path to travel away from your home is very important.
- 2. Start bringing any loose outdoor items inside. The winds can be a big problem, so it's always a good idea to bring things like lawn ornaments or trash cans inside. Of even more importance this year is eliminating any type of container that can fill up with water. Standing water can quickly become a mosquito breeding ground. And with the recent nationwide outbreak of West Nile Virus, we need to take every precaution.
- 3. Secure your property. Take an assessment of the trees and shrubs in your yard. Are any of them dying? Dead trees are

more susceptible to wind damage. Are any limbs a threat to your power lines? It might be a good idea to have a professional contractor check them out. Or, contact your utility provider.

- 4. Put together an emergency kit. It should have enough supplies to last you and your family for three days. Some of the basic items include: bottled water, non-perishable food, first aid kit, flashlight, radio, batteries, medications, baby formula and copies of important documents. A detailed list of emergency kit essentials can be found online at the Montgomery County Department of Public Safety Facebook page.
- 5. Put together a communications plan. Does everyone in your family have a cell phone? Do you know each other's phone number? There's one certainty when it comes to cell phones the batteries always lose their charge! That's why you should make a written list of all the numbers you might need, just in case you don't have a way to recharge your phone. It's also a good idea to designate a rendezvous point in case your family members are away from the house and disaster strikes. One option is another family member's house. Or consider someplace more public, like a shopping mall.

## **Burning in Lower Gwynedd**

Fall is just a few months away—in spite of the heat we are all feeling now. When it finally does arrive, thoughts will turn to disposing of leaves and other debris from our natural surroundings. Burning may be one of the solutions that residents will consider for disposal. IF that is the case, please be aware of the following:

- Leaf burning is not allowed in Lower Gwynedd—at any time.
- Burning of trash or garbage is also not permitted.
- Burning of yard waste is permitted in the months of November, December, April and May.
- All fires must be attended by a responsible adult with a hose within 50 feet of the burn site.
- Burning is allowed only during daylight hours. Care must be taken to avoid burning tree trunks and similar items that will continue to burn after sunset. The fire is to be completely extinguished at sunset.
- Bonfires and other ceremonial fires require a permit from the Township Fire Marshal's office.
- The Township Fire Marshal or the fire chief can order any fire to be extinguished, regardless of time of day or time of year.
