Commission members are not compensated, serve four year terms, and provide important functions for the community. The purpose and duty of the Planning Commission is to advise the Board of Supervisors concerning the most expedient methods of promoting the orderly development of our community. Zoning, subdivision and land development ordinances must be submitted to the Planning Commission for review prior to action by the Board of Supervisors. Likewise, all proposals for development of land must also be reviewed by the Planning Commission. The Planning Commission continues to serve an indispensable role in maintaining the Township's beauty and quality of life.

One of the major projects the Planning Commission will be dealing with in the coming months is the redevelopment of the Spring House Shopping Center including a Whole Foods Supermarket.

Whole Foods Inc. announced on Tuesday, May 6, 2014 that the supermarket chain specializing in natural foods had signed a lease with Stoltz Management, Inc. (Stoltz) to locate a 45,000-square foot store in the Spring House Village Shopping Center in Lower Gwynedd. It is anticipated that Stoltz will be submitting Plans for the Center to the Township in the near future. The Planning Commission will provide a venue for citizens to review the Stoltz plans.

Along with the Spring House Shopping Center, the Planning Commission will be reviewing other proposed projects including Foulkeways additions, the Comprehensive Plan Update and future planning for the Dow Chemical site.



Notes from the Fire Marshal

As we enjoy Summer, we know that Fall and Winter will soon be upon us. Now is the time to prepare for those seasons. Last Winter, 80 percent of property-damaging fires in the Township resulted from or started in fireplaces or chimneys. This year, please consider doing the following before the heating season:

- · Have your fireplace and chimney checked by a Chimney Sweep or Chimney specialist.
- Repair any cracks or damage before using the fireplace or chimney again
- Make sure the Chimney is clean. Studies have shown that one fire in a chimney will cause enough damage to require reconstruction of the chimney

This is also a good time to check your fire warning systems, specifically:

- · Have your annual fire alarm system check completed
- Consider changing any kitchen smoke detectors to heat detectors to reduce the possibility of a visit from your volunteers because of smoke from burnt toast.

Finally, the Township has received requests to burn during the prohibited months. There is no open burning allowed except during the months of April, May, November and December.

A STORMWATER PRIMER

Using Nature to Go Green

Water conservation is always an important tool in managing your environment, regardless of the abundance of the natural water supplies. Landscaping to minimize watering includes planning, using drought-resistant plant species, improving soils and using mulches to retain moisture in the soil. Plant species such as sedums, potentillas, grasses and herbs or other non-invasive ornamental plants have low water needs and may adapt to drier landscapes.

Another "storm water savvy" technique is to store roof rain water runoff in rain barrels for use in gardens and on lawns. Directing your downspouts away from your home's foundation and onto lawn or garden areas is another way of turning a potential problem into a benefit. Create a rain garden in a shallow basin on your lot by planting moisture loving plants and then direct your roof or driveway runoff to this area. Water will filter into the ground rather than running off the property to the nearest storm drain. Rain gardens also create new habitats and prevent storm water pollution problems.



Deer have also become a major problem in suburban areas due to the development of former forests and woodlands and the use of more edible plant species in traditional landscaping. Residents resort to fences, repellents, or bright, flashy objects in an effort to deter deer from destroying their landscape. Most control measures only work for short periods of time until deer become acclimated to the sight or smell of the repellent. However, deer tend to avoid plants with thorny stems or prickly leaves and plants with strong aromas, such as bayberry, boxwood, potentilla, roses and hollies. Planting these types of species can be an aid in "deer-proofing" your garden areas.

Simple changes such as those described may help your landscape contribute to the health of our environment and the protection of our water quality.

DON'T BE A VICTIM OF FRAUD

Consumers lose billions of dollars each year to fraud. People over age 50 are especially vulnerable and account for over half of all victims, according to a study conducted by AARP. Criminals use everyday tools such as the mailbox, telephone and the Internet to separate victims from their money.

A popular scam targeting senior citizens involves a simple phone call. An excited but believable caller promises exorbitant lottery winnings or an unexpected inheritance from an old friend. Oh, but there's a catch. To claim your winnings, the victim must first send a percentage of the prize in cash to cover the transfer of the winnings, tax, or other associated fees. When confronted with a surprise \$8 million dollar prize, sending \$800 to cover fees sounds reasonable. The problem is that the prize money never comes.



Another common scam is committed by imposter contractors and home improvement workers. This scam may involve multiple criminals. The first "contractor" will ring the doorbell or approach a senior outside. A second criminal will attempt to enter the house while the homeowner is distracted. The homeowner may be offered services such as roofing, driveway repair, or electrical services at a greatly reduced price in an effort to keep them engaged in conversation. All the while, the criminal is inside the home stealing cash, jewelry, and irreplaceable heirlooms.

A final scam involves a frantic, panicked, difficult to understand phone call from a grandchild in distress. This "grandchild" won't identify themselves by name until the unsuspecting grandparent asks if it's "Johnny" or "Sally" or "Michael". This devious caller will claim that they need money quickly because they are in trouble, but please don't tell mom and dad! They'll ask for money to be sent, the secret is kept, and is often quickly forgotten.

Please remember, while criminals may be targeting our senior citizens, any of our residents may receive such phone calls or unwanted business solicitors. It is everyone's responsibility to be informed and aware. 



Lower Gwynedd Township Supervisor Ed Brandt was recently featured in an article in PSATS Magazine for his many years of service in local government. He was recognized specifically for his 26 consecutive years as a Township Supervisor, although his service to the Township actually extends all the way back to 1982, when he coordinated a bug spraying program for the Township. From there, Mr. Brandt served four years on the Zoning Hearing Board, and when the Board of Supervisors grew from three to five members, he threw his hat in the ring. "I was happy with the community and didn't want to run against another supervisor," he says. "Because of the two new seats, I didn't have to." A year after being elected Supervisor, Mr. Brandt was elected Chairman, a role he alternated with Kate Harper every two years until she won a seat in the State House in the late 1990s. Mr. Brandt remained Chairman until two years ago, but still serves as a Township Supervisor.

In addition to fulfilling his duties as an elected official, Mr. Brandt began the annual Volunteer Banquet in 1993 to recognize residents who go above and beyond to help the community. Mr.

Brandt's own community involvement has always stretched beyond the Township's borders as well. He joined the Jaycees in 1975 and chaired the Christmas parade in Ambler for 25 years. After switching to the Kiwanis Club in Ambler, he originated the July 4 carnival and fireworks in 1981, which he ran for three decades. In 1984, he became president of the club and soon after was named a Distinguished President. Mr. Brandt has also served as president of the local elementary school's home school association and president of the Lower Gwynedd Little League for 10 years. Mr. Brandt's commitment to making his community a better place to live and work earned him the PSATS President's Leadership Award in 2004.

Ed Brandt truly exemplifies what service is all about. He has been such a strong leader over the years, setting the tone for everyone who works at the Township. Lower Gwynedd is very grateful for his continued commitment and dedication to local government!

TOWNSHIP RECEIVES \$346,000 PENNDOT GRANT

Some traffic relief is on the way for motorists driving through Spring House. In January, 2014 PennDOT announced that Lower Gwynedd Township will receive a \$346,000 grant from PennDOT to install an adaptive traffic signal control system at four intersections:

- 1. Norristown Road/Sumneytown Pike and Bethlehem Pike
- 2. Moore Drive and Bethlehem Pike
- 3. Penllyn Pike and Bethlehem Pike
- 4. Wellington Dr. and Sumneytown Pike

The new state of the art control system will adjust the timing of the traffic lights to coincide with existing traffic in real time. According to Ken O'Brien of McMahon Associates, the new system will improve the efficiency of the signals by about 20%. It will not solve our traffic problems but it should certainly help reduce periodic traffic back-ups. A dedicated left turn signal for Sumneytown Pike traffic for vehicles turning onto North Bethlehem Pike will also be included. The Project is scheduled for completion in the fall of 2015. Kathy Hunsicker, Chair of the Board of Supervisors, stated that the grant award was welcome news, especially with the announcement that Whole Foods Supermarket will be moving to the Spring House Village Shopping Center.

D-Day Veterans from Lower Gwynedd Township Honored

Two Lower Gwynedd Township residents were recently honored for their military service during World War II. With June 2014 marking the 70th anniversary of the Normandy Invasion, Herb Levy and William (Bill) Notley, both residents of Foulkeways at Gwynedd and both Normandy veterans, were invited to France to participate in the anniversary activities.

Levy and Notley were interviewed in January by a group of French students and journalists for the students' "70 Voices of Freedom" project. The goal of the project was to learn about the invasion from 70 firsthand accounts of veterans from 12 different countries. At the conclusion of their interview, the two veterans were invited by the students to visit France for the anniversary ceremonies, at the expense of the French government.

The two men, along with two guests each, flew from Philadelphia to Paris on June 1 and then took a train to Caen for the first of numerous ceremonial events. Other locations the men visited included Sword Beach and Utah Beach. One of the many highlights of the trip was when Mr. Levy was stopped on the street by a man who admired the French Legion of Honor medal he was wearing. The stranger, who told Levy "I want to thank you for all that you've done for us", happened to be the Premier of France.

Lower Gwynedd Township is proud of Mr. Levy and Mr. Notley and of all the veterans in our Township!


NOMINATE CITIZEN OF THE YEAR
