

WORK NOTICE: Penllyn Culvert Rehabilitation – Pole Removals

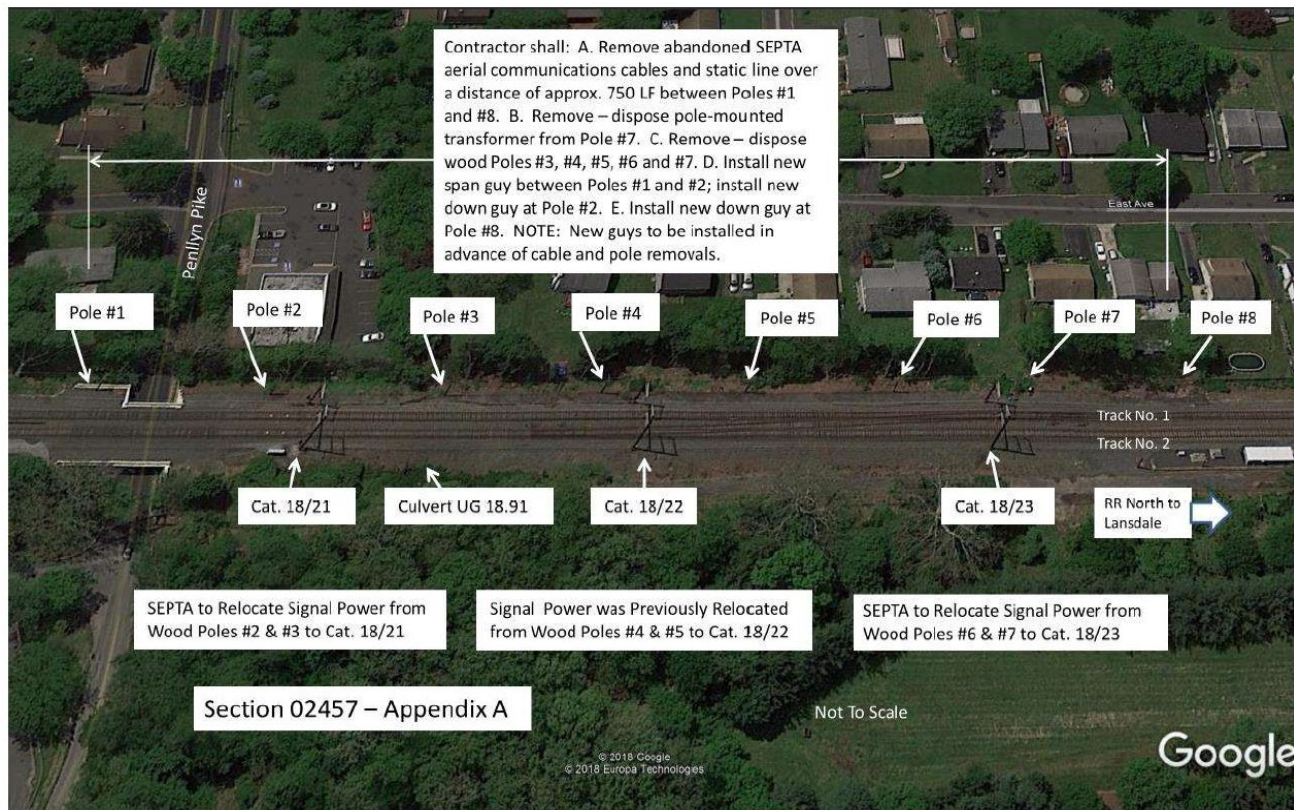
This notice is to confirm SEPTA's in-person discussions with residents on Nov. 11, 2021, regarding access to remove the wooden poles near the base of the tracks.

LOCATION: Railroad tracks behind the 1000 block of East Avenue and 400 block of Mansion Avenue in Lower Gwynedd Township, Montgomery County.

RAIL LINE: Lansdale/Doylestown Line

TIMING: Work dates have not yet been determined but it is expected to be before the end of the year. SEPTA's Contractor anticipates completing this work during a two-week period. Work will be conducted during the daytime hours from 7:30 am to 3 pm.

WORK TO BE PERFORMED: SEPTA's Contractor will be accessing SEPTA right of way through the backyards of the homeowners listed below to reach wooden poles on SEPTA property. In some instances, the Contractor will set up a manlift in a backyard to reach the wooden poles near the base of the tracks. The manlift is equipped with rubber tracks and can be folded to a width of 35 inches to access through narrow areas. This equipment will not cause damage to homeowners' properties. The Contractor will reach out from the backyards for safe removal of five abandoned wooden poles. Property owners at the following addresses on East Avenue (**1033, 1029, 1025 and 1021**) as well as Mansion Avenue (**420, 422 and 424**) will likely be impacted. This work is part of a SEPTA project to rehabilitate the Penllyn Culvert. Please see image below for more details.
