Lower Gwynedd Township EAC Annual Report of Activities 2021

Land Stewardship:

-Completed application for Tree City membership, which was submitted by Township staff to the organization; awaiting notification of status,

-Submitted proposal to BOS to establish a tree giveaway program; budget authority has been allocated for 2022. This program, along with Tree City status, has relevance to stormwater mitigation as well as land stewardship.

-At request of township staff, developed landscaping plan for Penllyn Woods flagpole. -Purchased new Spotted Lanternfly Swatters for distribution to LGT residents.

-Participated in regional discussions to revitalize the Bird Town initiative with new programming to come in 2022 (also has implications for water stewardship).

-Proposed volunteer clean-up days for Norristown Rd exits of Rte 309; received budget 2022 budget authority for police staffing and supplies for this project.

Water Stewardship:

-Researched and developed a plan for signage that identifies major stream crossings within the township with a goal of raising awareness of the importance to LGT of water and watershed issues.

-Continued close monitoring of local and statewide developments concerning PFAS contamination.

Resource Conservation:

-Sponsored an in-person presentation by Colleen Falicki (Back to Earth Composting) on home composting and reducing food waste.

-Participated in discussions of plastic bag bans/fees that are taking place among several local municipalities; began developing plans for outreach to businesses and residents regarding this issue, should the BOS approve such outreach.

-Diverted 21 five-gallon buckets of batteries from landfills through the Battery Solutions recycling program.

-Offered recycling of damaged/broken Christmas lights.

Communications:

-Worked with township staff to update the EAC section of the township website.

-Began a "Green Tip of the Month" for the townships e-news.

-Submitted 1-3 articles for each LGT print newsletter covering a wide range of topics.

-Advised residents regarding bird-feeding restrictions called for over the summer.

-Participated in FallFest.

Council Governance:

-Addressed several governance issues, including revisions to by-laws; solidifying committee structure; and clarifying scope of activity of individual committees.

-Developed a set of programming goals and priorities for 2022.
